by floodwaters from Hurricane Florence.

During a recent visit to help local volunteer coordinator,

was spent in the hard-hit neighborhood of Haiti
(pronounced hay-tie). Residents were still cleaning up—
some preparing to rebuild, while others face uncertainty
due to lack of resources.

in 1999. Even though they recently lost possessions and
must replace the floor and walls of Ms. Mattie’s home, this
