Through the Missions portion of our FBC budget, we give **\$100** a month (**\$1200** a year) to the **BACKPACK SNACKS OF FRANKFORT/FRANKLIN COUNTY**.

They rely completely on donations from the community to provide weekend meals for hungry students. They use **100%** of the donations to buy food for these students. This past semester they sent home **2,363** weekend meal bags with students. That is an increase of **589** bags over the previous year. The number of students needing help has been rising steadily throughout the year. They will begin the new semester helping **229** students with food for the weekend.
