The ladies and youth ministered to families and helped me get caught up on so many smaller tasks.

We also received an anonymous donation of \$1,000 to help with the cost of setting the Septic tank.

And we received a donation of 756 cans of food from Roger Scott (Gary's brother).

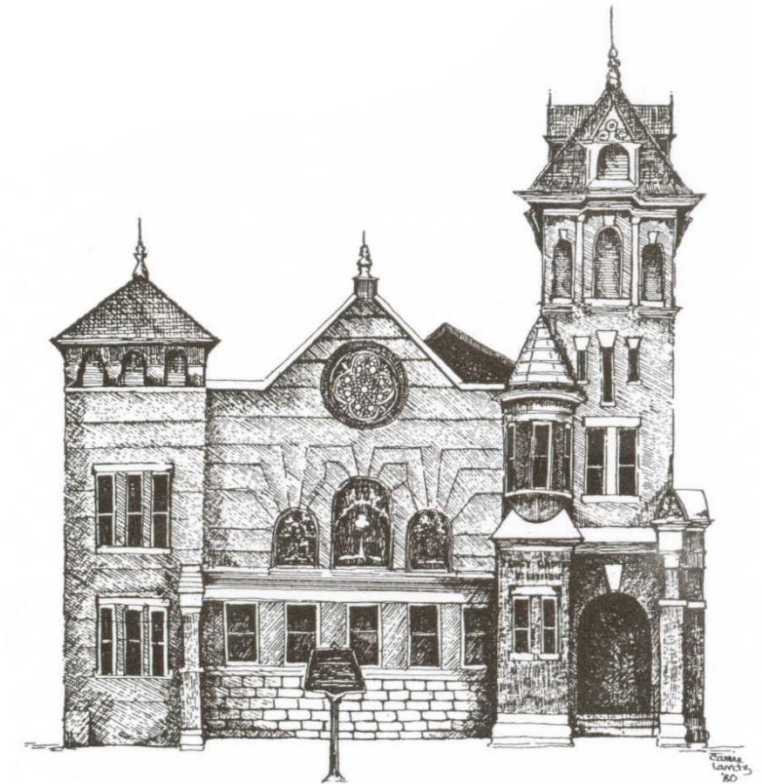
