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On March 19, the Board of the Mission Frankfort Clinic met and had good attendance and discussion. The board took a 'field trip'



We have new signage inside the clinic (thank you to Gary Scott for helping in this area). Our pharmacy has been rearranged and reorganized to better serve our patients and volunteer providers. We have new computers for Dana's office, the Patient Assistance Program office and the Pharmacy. Some had not seen our digital dental x-ray that was installed some time ago. We have a new EKG machine and defibrillator. We have begun work on what will be our new exam rooms in the back hall of our clinic space – all the rooms have been cleared and wall prep for paint has started. We have a new logo (pictured) for the clinic done by graphic designer Claudia Summers (daughter-in-law of the infamous Richard Summers). Plans are being made to redesign our new patient room/space (old Hispanic Worship Room – for those who have been here awhile!) into a prosthodontic lab where dentures and partials will be made in-house! Please pray for the outstanding grant requests that are presently being decided on by the City of Frankfort, Franklin County Fiscal Court and the Good Samaritan Foundation.

Sixty-five thousand dollars is the total amount requested from these three organizations. I believe prayer has been an important piece of the approvals in the past. Thank you for all the support! What a privilege it is to be on staff at FBC and get to serve alongside Dana Nickels, our hard-working Clinic Administrator.

Thank you to all who contributed to the 'special' request from Karen Thomas Smith who leads the mission we support in Morocco. The 'Welcoming Children' program is one part of the larger ministry plan to help refugees coming to Morocco. This program helps families get assistance from the Moroccan government for their children. We gave \$750 from our 'Local to Global' missions line item of our FBC budget (recommendation from our Missions Advisory Team) and an additional \$300 was also donated by FBC members.


- 1. The Word Made Flesh


