



so with great integrity, wisdom, and grace. He has loved and led us well and I will miss him greatly. Well done thy good and faithful servant!


I would certainly be remiss if I didn't also express my deep appreciation for Jackie Browning. Jackie has been an integral part of our music ministry and she will be sore-


