

We had a great response to the congregational survey. By using the survey system, we were able to breakdown the information quickly and in a beneficial manner. It will help us finalize the church and pastor profiles and enable us to design questions for prospective senior pastors to increase our ability to discern God's will for our church at this time. We have met with the leadership on the Youth Transition and Search Team and they gave us additional insight into how we can work together. We will both use the same church profile so we will have a consistent description of FBC. Beginning October 1, we will start formally publicizing our search and officially accepting resumes.
