

Thank you to all who participated in our prayer emphasis during January and February. The younger adult Bible Study classes were challenged to grow in our prayer lives through videos, discussion around the tables, practical suggestions and personal testimonies from one another. Others gathered on Wednesday evenings to pray the Psalms and offer intercession for our FBC members

and friends and still others utilized our daily prayer calendar. Our group study of Richard Foster's, Prayer: Finding the Heart's True Home will conclude on Tuesday, March 7.

We soon enter the season of Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 1, through Easter, April 16. I hope that you will consider how you might join much of the Christian community around the world in a time of reflection, repentance (changing of our ways), and renewal. The forty days of Lent (excluding Sundays which are always a celebration of Jesus' resurrection) mirror forty years of wilderness wandering for the people of Israel and the forty days Jesus endured in the wilderness after his baptism. The early church would spend the 40 days of Lent teaching candidates for baptism about the basics of the faith and then celebrate Easter with the baptism of these new Christians. Today Lent still helps us mindfully prepare to come closer and closer to the awesome mystery of Easter!

For those seeking a small group or simply 'formational friendships' with people willing to make 6 weeks of Lent a time of an intentional journey of grace together, I will facilitate 2 groups on the topic, Less Is More. The weekly themes and brief daily readings are outlined here.

Confession: less guilt/more grace; Solitude: less stuff/more freedom; Frugality: less spending/more peace; Intercession: less me/more others; Reflective Reading of Holy Week story: less fear/more love. A breakfast group will gather Tuesdays beginning March 7, 6:45-7:45 a.m. A lunch group will gather on Thursdays beginning March 9, 12-1pm. Meeting time and place will be finalized according to the participants. If you have interest, but neither of these times suits vou, please let Cynthia know. Have you ever explored your hymnal? I encourage you to go to the back of the hymnal sometime when you have the opportunity and see the wealth of information that is there. Immediately following the last hymn in the hymnal is an Outline of the Christian Year which is helpful if this is new to you. Following that is a three page essay on Worship and the Christian Year. Following that are



several indexes which you might find helpful if you are searching for a particular hymn or scripture reference within a hymn. The indexes are:

Page 2

- copyrights (a legal necessity)
- Authors, Composers, and Sources listing the names of the text writers, tune composers and other sources of the songs.
- Scriptural Readings –Texts from scripture found for unison or responsive readings
- Topical Index of Readings
- Metrical Index of Tunes by Poetic Meter—The poetic meter is the number of syllables in a line of text in a hymn.
 Hymns with the same poetic meter can be sung interchangeably with the tune from the other.
- Alphabetical Index of Tunes
- Scriptural Bases of Hymns
- Topical Index of Hymns
- First Lines and Titles—easiest way to look up a hymn!

Explore your hymnal! Perhaps you might even want to purchase one for your devotional use. If so, please see me and I'll be glad to order one for you!

This new class, under the direction of Keith Felton and Ben and Jamie McKown, is for young adults who do not yet have a Sunday School class. This class is open to couples and singles.

Ten were in attendance for this first class, and others who expressed an interest in this class but were unable to come to the first one plan to join. We look forward to seeing them in coming weeks, along with anyone else who wishes to be a part of this mean-ingful time of Bible study and fellowship.

Last Sunday, Cynthia had refreshments in the assembly room. There was a festive atmosphere and warm, welcoming spirit in the room.

I felt the energy the moment I walked in and began speaking to all who came. How exciting it was to see new faces as well as those who are faithful attenders! Thanks, Cynthia, for coordinating all this and so much more in your role as our Spiritual Formations Minister.

Nursery, Preschool and Children

There is more good news. Cynthia reported that last Sunday we had a nursery full of babies and toddlers and the largest group of Godly Play kids' worship attendees in a long time.

My heart is overflowing with gratitude for all our members who work with our children to teach them about God's goodness and faithfulness. I can think of no greater responsibility or higher privilege than this! Payday Lending Ministry

I am also pleased to hear that we have deposited over \$4,000 into the Pay Day Lending Account at the Commonwealth Credit Union. This money will be used to help people caught in a predatory loan where they are paying an exorbitant amount of interest, sometimes as high as 400%.

Approved applicants will be able to take out a loan with Commonwealth Credit at a 3% interest rate. The money we have deposited at Commonwealth Credit will be used as secured collateral.

The loan with the predatory lender will be paid off and the applicant will begin paying Commonwealth Credit. As this loan is paid back, this money will go back into our secured collateral account and be used to help others struggling to pay off a debt with such a high interest rate.

I am excited about this new ministry the church endorsed in a January business meeting. First Baptist is one of the first churches in Kentucky to address a growing need among the poorest of our citizens.

I especially appreciate Keith Felton and our lay leaders who have worked diligently to get this ministry off the ground. Helping people get out from under an insurmountable debt and teaching them how to manage money and take care of their families is another way FBC is making hope visible.
