MISSIONS

We learned at the beginning of January that a mission group from our area and other parts of Kentucky going on a Dental Mission Trip to Honduras had to can-

cel their trip at the last minute. Mary Ann Burch, who heads up this annual mission trip, called me and asked if that group could serve the patients at the Mission Frankfort Clinic for a couple of days since their trip was cancelled and they had the time already blocked off. It was a 'no-brainer' for Dana Nickles (Mission Frankfort Clinic Administrator) and me to extend the invitation especially since we have been perpetually backed up trying to see all the dental patients on our waiting list. Dana began scheduling patients and we had over 60 patients scheduled for Jan. 22 and 23! This is by far the largest two day event our clinic has ever hosted and we are grateful for this answer to prayer in attempts to take care of all those on our waiting list. What a great blessing it is to have all of the dedicated dental volunteers who were heading to Honduras to serve those in need in our community. I'm sure they were probably and understandably disappointed about not getting to serve in Honduras, but with the needs in Frankfort and the existence of the Mission Frankfort Clinic, they were still able to do missions right here.

For 2017, the Mission Frankfort Clinic had 732 medical patient visits and 128 dental patient visits. Dana Nickles is entering her second year as our Clinic Administrator and doing an excellent job. We have added a few medical and dental volunteers. We have three outstanding interns – two from Georgetown College and one from Transylvania University. Every time I go up to the clinic, I think of Matthew 25 and Jesus saying, "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." Thank you for your continued prayers and support of the MFC.

During our Sunday morning worship service on Feb 11, we will hear from Vicky Mitchell who will give us a report on our **Payday Loan Ministry** which is coming up on our *one year anniversary*. The sneak peak is the ministry has been very successful and life changing for those we've helped. Thank you for supporting this ministry as we do our best to help individuals get out of the predatory payday lending industry.

A CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP Adults and teens are invited to the first of three School for Discipleship days in 2018!

On Saturday, February 24, 9:00 - 2:00, Dr. Sheila Klopfer, religion professor from Georgetown College, will lead us in a study of what Jesus meant when he said, "Take up your cross and follow me." (Matt.16). Dr. Klopfer shares, "It's a discussion that can help us better understand [Christ's] life and ministry and, as such, better understand our own place in God's reconciling work in creation. I'm not talking about merely the historical event of the cross, but it's ultimate significance. Jesus didn't die of pneumonia. He wasn't killed by King Herod as an infant. He lived a life that led to a particular death, and called his followers to discover the power of the cross."

The call to follow Jesus is a call to...

We feed Jesus' sheep when we...

These are the two statements we are working on this year and will address in sermons and small group studies. They are part of our theme for 2018—FBC263: A Call to Discipleship.

263 is the number of times the word disciple or discipleship is repeated in the New Testament. This is in contrast to the word Christian, which is mentioned only three times and Christianity, which is never written.

This year our goal is to discover why the word 'disciple' was chosen so often by biblical writers to describe those who followed Jesus. What message were they sending their readers about what it means to follow Jesus and feed his sheep?

Make a point to be in worship on Sundays and to sign up for small group studies that will be offered throughout the year. If you do, I am confident you will develop a clearer understanding of who a disciple is and what followers of Jesus are supposed to do. **End of the Year Financial Report**

The final figures are in for 2017, and I want to thank you for your generosity. Your attentiveness to our finances and faithful giving each week humble and please me.

The 2017 Budget was \$887,056. Given through tithes, offerings, income from trusts, estates and fees totaled \$958,823. I am overwhelmed by your generosity. Your faithfulness makes it possible for us to meet the needs of those who are struggling to survive and to strengthen the faith of those who look to our church for spiritual education and guidance.

I am also grateful for the members of our church who remembered our church in their wills. We received gifts near the end of the year from the estates of two of our former members. Their confidence in us and desire to support God's work after they were called home mean more than words can adequately express.

There is a verse in Hebrews that speaks to me about estate giving. "By faith Abel was commended as a righteous man when God spoke well of his offerings. And by faith he still speaks, even though he is dead." (Hebrews 11:4)

Through estate planning and giving, our voices can still be heard, and our support of the ministries of our church can continue. The same transformative ministries we invested our time, talents and resources in while we lived can thrive after we are gone if we remember the church in our wills.

I encourage you to revisit your will to see if you have remembered the church in the distribution of your possessions and resources. In my opinion, this is an important part of being a faithful steward. Jackie and I have done this and periodically review and update it. Both of us want the vital and life-changing ministries of First Baptist Church and other organizations to continue after the Lord calls us home. How grateful we are to be a part of a church that takes discipleship and stewardship seriously. This is the kind of fertile soil in which faith grows.
