The Mission Frankfort Clinic has received great news on all fronts this summer as we continue to follow Jesus in helping the impoverished and

healing the sick. The **City of Frankfort** is contributing \$15,000 during this new fiscal year! The Franklin County Fiscal Court continued their remarkable support as they, too, are granting us \$15,000. The Good Samaritan Foundation granted us \$35,000 this year! A local company, **Meritor**, is giving us \$1,250 this year! We continue to have new FBC folks sign up for the Kroger Community Rewards program and we are grateful. We are seeing our numbers in patient volume rise. We had 1,753 appointments in the past 12 months. We have new patients sign up every week. Dana Nickles continues to do a marvelous job in handling all the day to day work of the clinic. We have outstanding volunteers – both professional and lay – and we could not have this ministry without them. We need more medical providers. We need you to recruit for us as you go to medical offices. Also, if you see Tony Hager, FBC's Building Superintendent, please thank him for the fantastic job of painting he is doing in the MFC. If you haven't seen our new paint job, please go and see it! Thank you for all of your prayers and support.

The **Emma Quire Mission Center** is having a great summer as many groups travel to Owsley County to minister. A special thanks goes to our FBC group, headed by Gary Scott, who went recently to build a much needed ramp for a house and family in need. Gary Forman, Treasurer for the EQMC Board, and Vanessa Garland, EQMC Director, have been working hard on our first grant application. Please pray for that process. Vanessa sent me this... "Hugenot Baptist Church is here this week. They are hosting a Day Camp that has robotics, crafts, clowning, theater, music, dance, and missions. It is truly awesome! Kids are having a blast!"

The **Payday Ministry** continues to be a light in our community as we see more and more clients trapped in this predatory industry. God opened a huge door for us as we received our largest single donation to date -\$5,000!! We are thankful for this and the timing could not have been better. As our first year and a half of ministry was approaching, we were almost at capacity of people we could help and then this gift arrived! We continue to 'recycle' the money as individuals pay back, and we are encouraged to be able to help more people. Thank you for helping with this valuable ministry to our community.

FBC263 A CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP

As the new school year starts, we will refocus our attention on our FBC263: A Call to Discipleship theme that we launched in January of this year.

Remember that 263 is the number of times that the word 'disciple' or 'discipleship' is mentioned in the New Testament to describe those who responded to Jesus' call and followed him. In the Spring, through a sermon series, daily devotionals, seminars and book groups, we unpacked how a call to discipleship is a call to pray, trust, love, forgive, learn, encourage, serve, obey, and sacrifice.


With this calling in mind, this Fall we will revisit FBC263 and explore the phrase, "We feed Jesus' sheep when we...." It comes from Jesus' encounter with Peter recorded in John 21. The resurrected Christ asks Peter three times, "Do you love me?". Each time Peter answers affirmatively. Each time Jesus responds, "Then feed my sheep."

Let's take a closer look at this story and consider in depth how our love for Jesus is shown in the ways that we feed his sheep. We'll address this idea in worship, in small groups, in seminars and devotionals in the coming months. Thanks to the Spiritual Formation Advisory Team for their help in planning.

In what way will you respond to the call to discipleship? How will you feed Jesus' sheep?

Children's Choirs




Youth Handbells


