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PAYDAY LENDING MINISTRY UPDATE: The following is a recent report from VICKY MITCHELL and our PAYDAY LENDING MINISTRY COMMITTEE – "We just hit our two-

year anniversary February 1! We have helped a total of 35 people and loaned over \$19,000. Fourteen of the 35 have paid in full. Eighteen of the loans are still in progress and the balances have dwindled to just over \$5k. So that means we have a full \$5,000 we could loan!! We started our program with an initial \$5,900 deposit. In 2018 we received five deposits – four of those totaled \$1,000, and then we had the generous gift of \$5,000. Our account balance is currently \$10,623." We are very happy with the progress of the program and God has connected us to folks who have greatly benefitted from our program. Please be in prayer for our committee and help us spread the word about what we are doing. We have more money to help individuals get out of the payday debt trap.

EMMA QUIRE MISSION CENTER UPDATE: Vanessa Garland (Emma Quire Mission Center Director) and I spoke on the phone this week about all the incredible ministries being planned for spring and summer. Most dates for April, June, July and August are filled with mission teams coming to take on various projects to help the good folks of Owsley County. One project that will be ongoing throughout most of the summer will be to help with a particular housing situation for a family. I asked Vanessa to send me some info about the project and what they need. There is a major part of this project that needs a financial benefactor, a team to do the install - or both would be fine, too!

Spread the word and pray that God will place this family and need on someone's heart who has the resources to assist. THANK YOU. (The septic tank portion of this letter is the special request I'm referring to)



What if we were that excited about encountering God when we gather on Sundays? We are missing something when we are less excited about meeting God than three year olds are about meeting their grandfather. I'm certainly guilty of this. So many things capture my attention, and I miss out on the greatest thing. This Lenten season, may we all become as children again and recognize the joy of coming into the presence of God; and with praise, confession, repentance, assurance of forgiveness, worship God, hear Him speak and faithfully and courageously respond!

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
