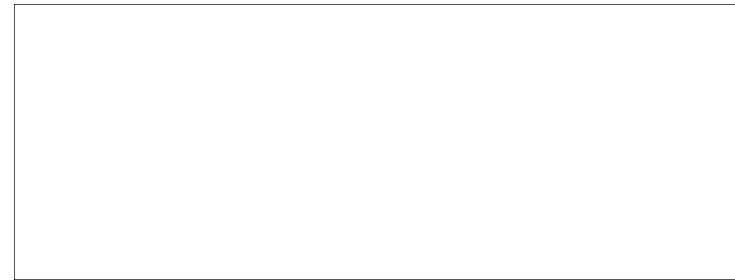

tacted me about this and also wanted to know more about our work to see if we could be a place for them to donate their remaining assets. To keep a long story short, they voted to donate their remaining funds of over **\$5,800!!** We are grateful for the support. LOVING GOD AND NEIGHBOR DEVOTIONAL REFLECTIONS

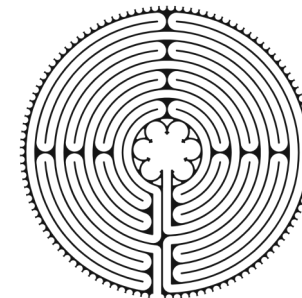

June 30, 6:30 p.m.

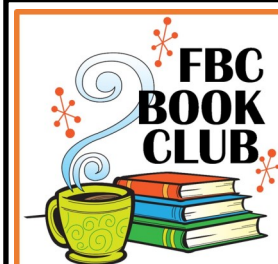

Our first book is *The Road Back to You: An Enneagram Journey to Self-Discovery* by Ian Morgan Cron and Suzanne Stabile. This book would make a great introduction to Enneagrams for any who are thinking about joining the twelve session Enneagram study that Cynthia Insko will lead in the Fall or those who are simply wanting to understand more about the Enneagram. About the Book: What you don't know about yourself can hurt you and your relationships—and maybe even how you make your way in the world. It can also keep you in the shallows with God.

The Enneagram is an ancient personality type system with an uncanny accuracy in describing how human beings are wired, both positively and negatively. *The Road Back to You* forges a unique approach—a practical, comprehensive way of accessing Enneagram wisdom and exploring its connections with Christian spirituality for a deeper knowledge of God and of ourselves.

Funny and filled with stories, this book allows you to understand more about each of the Enneagram types. Beginning with changes you can start making today, the wisdom of the Enneagram can help you get on the road that will take you further along into who you really are—leading you into places of spiritual discovery you would never have found on your own.
